Dear all,

On Monday, I was at the Faculty meeting for the Deputy Heads of Research at the Faculty, arranged by the Vice Dean for Research and Faculty staff. An important focus area for the Faculty as well as the individual departments in the coming is how to increase the external funding. One of the topics on the meeting agenda was how to prepare for the coming call for Centres of Excellence by the Research Council in 2020.

The Norwegian Centres of Excellence (SFF) programme gives the best scientists in Norway the opportunity to organize their research in centres in order to reach ambitious scientific goals. The Research Council aims at selecting new Centres of Excellence every fifth year and the next call for applications will presumably be opened in late 2020.

While project funding from RCN is usually granted for a period of 3-4 years, the granted SFF applications have a possibility for receiving financial support for up to 10 years (5+5 years). This will give the involved institutions room for restructuring their research environments, and develop new collaborations and excellent research. There are currently two SFFs at the Faculty, CCBIO and CISMAC.

The Faculty of Medicine encourages us to start preparing for the upcoming call already now. Potential applicants from the departments should be identified, and plans should be made for supporting these research environments in positioning themselves for the call. Together with our new Research Advisor Michaël Marie and the Faculty of Medicine, we will start to make plans towards the upcoming call in 2020. It is important to emphasize that not only the researchers will be involved in efforts towards a successful grant, but also Master students and Ph.D.-candidates, postdocs and technical personnel.

BOT-Anna (reiseregning)

Tips til utfylling av reiseregningen

Når du fyller ut en reiseregning er det noen enkle tips som gjør at reiseregningen kan bli raskere attestert og godkjent:

- 1) Kun ett utlegg på én linje - og last opp kvitteringen for dette utlegget på samme linje. Hvilke utlegg som ikke krever kvittering ser du når du fyller ut i reiseregningen. Vi anbefaler at du ikke lenger "bunkescanner", men legger kvitteringen for hvert utlegg på hver linje.
- 2) Beløpet du angir må være identisk med beløpet på kvitteringen - inkludert ørebeløpet! Dette gjelder også utenlandsk valuta.
- 3) Datoen på utleggslinjen må være innenfor reisens start og slutt. På billetter som er kjøpt på forhånd er det reisedato som skal oppgis, ikke kjøpsdato.
- 4) Bruk gjerne mobiltelefonen til å ta bilde av kvitteringen! Aller best bildekvalitet oppnår du ved å legge kvitteringen på en hvit bakgrunn.
- 5) Om du har tatt bilde av flere kvitteringer i ett og samme bilde, ikke summer beløpet på én linje, men opprett like mange linjer som det finnes kvitteringer i bildet, og last opp det samme bildet på alle linjene.

«BOT-Anna» bruker merknadsfeltet til å skrive resultatet av kontrollene. Om du opplever at roboten har gjort feil, er det fint om du kommenterer det i merknadsfeltet og sender skjemaet videre i HR-portalen/Pagaweb som vanlig. Kontakt økonomiseksjonen hvis du har spørsmål.



BOT-Anna (travel reimbursement forms) going into phase 2

On Monday 01 October, BOT-Anna is going into phase 2 at the Medical Faculty.

This means:

- Travel reimbursement forms are returned to the employee if the bot encounters errors.
- The employee must then attempt to correct the errors and submit the form again
- If the bot once again encounters errors, the form will be forwarded to the local Financial Services Section. Each form will, as such, only be returned to the employee once.

PS: On Monday, controlling the form «Refusjon av utlegg» is activated. These will initially only go to the local Financial Services Section (phase 1) but eventually be returned to employees (phase 2).

Tips for filling in a travel expenses claim

Following the simple guidelines below will ensure faster approval of your travel expenses claim.

- 1) No more than one expenditure per line – and please upload the corresponding receipt to the same line. We recommend scanning the receipts separately as they need to be uploaded one at a time. Some expenses do not require a receipt – the system will tell you which ones when you start filling in the travel expenses claim.
- 2) The amount must be identical to that on the receipt. There needs to be an exact match between the travel expenses claim and the receipt also when it comes to foreign currency.
- 3) The date of your expenses must be within the departure and return date of your travel. For tickets paid in advance, you must state the date you are traveling and not the date you bought the ticket.
- 4) You can use your mobile phone to take a photo of the receipt. You will achieve the best quality if you place the receipt on a white background.
- 5) If there are several receipts on the same photo, please do not put the total amount on one line. You must add a new line for each receipt and upload the same photo to each line.

“BOT-Anna” will write the result of the controls in the comment field. If you believe the robot has made a mistake, please put a note in the comment field and send the form through the HR portal / Pagaweb as usual. Please contact Financial Services Section if you have any questions.

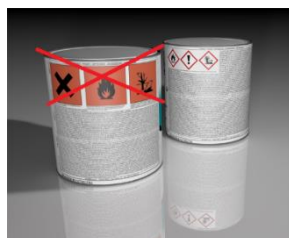
Kjemikaliemerking

Professor Daan van Aalten: “X-linked intellectual disability mutations in O-GlcNAc transferase”



University of Dundee, School of Life Sciences, Dundee, Scotland and Institute for Precision Medicine, Xiangya Hospital, Central South University, Changsha, China

Daan is a versatile structural biologist, whose work is aimed at understanding the functions of the O-GlcNAc post-translational modification. Workshop by Centre for Digital Life Norway: Ensuring New Antibiotics for the Future



This workshop aims to shed light on both new developments and old challenges in the field of antibiotics discovery and developing them into efficient medicine in a world increasingly challenged by antibiotics resistance.

It starts off with talks from Prof. Andriy Luzhetskyy (Univ. of Saarbrücken, Germany), Prof. Marnix Medema (Univ. of Wageningen, Netherlands) and Dr. David Mead (Varigen Biosciences Corp., USA), three international experts within their respective field of research who will tell us about their innovative approaches in discovering new antibiotics. Dr. Bert Klebl will then talk about his efforts at the Lead Discovery Centre in Dortmund, Germany, to bridge the gap between academia and industry.

In the afternoon we will focus on important societal aspects of antibiotics use and needs, including presentations by Prof. Bjørn Myskja from NTNU and The Norwegian Biotechnology Advisory Board and Kirsten Haugland from The Norwegian Cancer Society.

The workshop will take place at Scandic Lerkendal in Trondheim on **13 November**, from 9:00 to 16:00, and is free of charge for the participants.

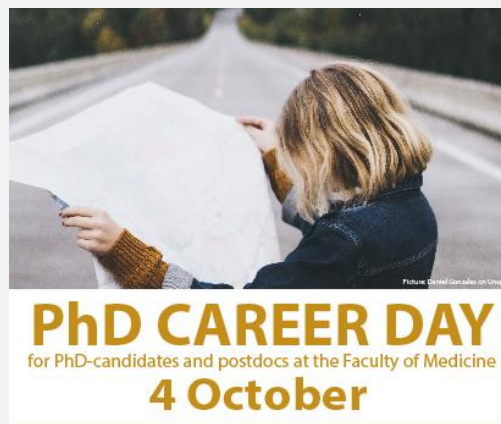

Current funding announcements/deadlines

The Research Council of Norway (NFR)

- **Commercial proof-of-concept funding:** A collaborative effort between the **BIOTEK2021**, **NANO2021**, **IKTPLUSS**, **Transport 2025**, **MAROFF**, **BIONÆR**, **SAMANSVAR** and **FORNY2020** programmes
- **Commercial proof-of-concept funding:** Project proposals must be able to point to research results that are mature enough to lead to significant improvements in the state of the art. Proof-of-concept projects are to be business-oriented and business-driven, not research-driven.
- **Milestone project:** A milestone project has a shorter duration and more limited scope than a commercialisation project. The objective is to achieve a rapid clarification of the project's most critical milestone. A positive outcome from a milestone project may lay the foundation for a new application for a standard commercialisation project. Applications seeking up to NOK 500 000 will automatically be categorised as milestone projects, and will be assessed by the FORNY programme administration. Applicants may expect to be notified of a funding decision after 2–4 weeks.

- **Collaboration with Swiss researchers:** researchers from Norway can now apply with partners in Switzerland for Swiss research funding. You can find more information on the website of the [Swiss National Science Foundation](#).



Deadline 1 October

- **Pre-projects in patient safety, multi-morbidity and/or oral health (BEHANDLING):** Pre-projects shall take the steps that are necessary for the idea to be realized into a main project, such as establishment of collaborations, summarizing knowledge, piloting, method development, etc. The first opportunity to apply for a main project will be April 2020. Project duration is between 6 and 12 months, and the budget lies in the range NOK 100 000 - 300 000.
