Dear colleagues at IBM,

IMPORTANT: clean up chemical spillage!

There has been a chemical spillage in a fume hood, where no one knew what was spilled.

When using shared equipment/ benches/ fume hoods or similar areas: be sure to clean up after yourself!.

Unidentified spills increase the risk of contamination of people and samples, and it is dangerous to clean this up without knowing the property of the substance.

Linda Stuhr og Rolf Reed går over fra matrixgruppen til CellNet gruppen

Rolf Reed og Linda Stuhr, sammen med teknisk personale Gerd Salvesen og Maria Tveitarås, og stipendiat Hilde Ytre-Hauge Smeland, vil fra 1. Oktober bli tilknyttet CellNet forskningsgruppen.

Overføring er hensiktsmessig siden forskningsprosjekter til Stuhr og Reed er stadig mer rettet mot eksperimentelle studier av mamma-cancer, som er det sentrale tema for forskningen i CellNet gruppen. Stuhr har satt opp xenograft-modeller som vil bli videre utviklet av Lorens og Halberg. Samtidig vil Reed og Stuhr gå inn i samarbeid rund Axl-studiene med Lorens, og forske på mus med knock-out lesjon for Epac sammen med Døskeland. Siden det tidligere samarbeid med Matrix-gruppen er nærmest avsluttet, er det hensiktsmessig å tilknytte Reed og Stuhr til CellNet gruppen.

Avdelingsingeniør Gerd Salvesen vil fortsette å samarbeide med Reed og Stuhr i CellNet gruppen.

Det vil i første omgang ikke medføre noen endringer i bruk av laboratorie- og kontorarealer.

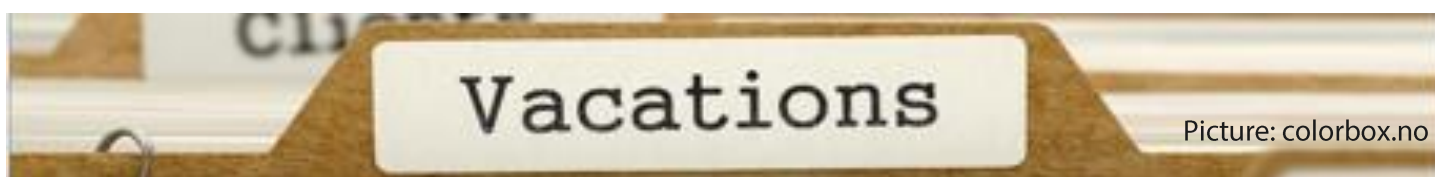
Linda Stuhr and Rolf Reed transfer from matrix group to CellNet group

Rolf Reed and Linda Stuhr, along with technicians Gerd Salvesen and Maria Tveitarås and PhD-candidate Hilde Ytre-Hauge Smeland, will from 01 October be incorporated into the CellNet Group.

The transfer is based on changes in the nature of current research projects, which are becoming increasingly directed at experimental studies of mamma-cancer, which is the central theme for the CellNet Group's research. Stuhr has constructed xenograft models which will be further developed by Lorens and Halberg. Furthermore, Reed and Stuhr will collaborate with Lorens on Axl studies and continue research on mice with knockout lesion for Epac with Døskeland. Since the earlier collaboration with the Matrix Group is close to finished, it makes sense to connect Reed and Stuhr to the CellNet Group.

Staff Engineer Gerd Salvesen will continue her collaboration with Reed and Stuhr in the CellNet Group.

The transfer will at this point not lead to any changes in the use of laboratory and office areas.

The Research Council of Norway (NFR)

- **NEW: Commercial proof-of-concept funding:** This call for proposals is part of a collaborative effort between the **BIOTEK2021, NANO2021, IKTPLUSS**, Transport 2025, MAROFF, BIONÆR, SAMANSVAR and FORNY2020 programmes. [The Norwegian webpage](#) contains more information about the template, evaluation criteria, etc. For this round you can apply for two types of projects, both with **deadline 10 October 2018**:
 - Commercial proof-of-concept funding: Project proposals must be able to point to research results that are mature enough to lead to significant improvements in the state of the art. Proof-of-concept projects are to be business-oriented and business-driven, not research-driven. Typical activities in the proof-of-concept phase may involve clarifying application and market potential; testing the concept, technology or prototype; demonstration; developing a business model; securing rights and establishing contact with customers and users.
 - Milestone project: A milestone project has a shorter duration and more limited scope than a commercialisation project. The objective is to achieve a rapid clarification of the project's most critical milestone. A positive outcome from a milestone project may lay the foundation for a new application for a standard commercialisation project. Applications seeking up to NOK 500 000 will automatically be categorised as milestone projects, and will be assessed by the FORNY programme administration. Applicants may expect to be notified of a funding decision after 2–4 weeks.

- [Pre-projects in patient safety, multi-morbidity and/or oral health \(BEHANDLING\)](#): Pre-projects shall take the steps that are necessary for the idea to be realized into a main project, such as establishment of collaborations, summarizing knowledge, piloting, method development, etc. The first opportunity to apply for a main project will be April 2020. Project duration is between 6 and 12 months, and the budget lies in the range NOK 100 000 - 300 000.

EDCTP is a public-public partnership between countries in Europe and sub-Saharan Africa, and the European Union which funds clinical research to accelerate the development of new or improved drugs, vaccines, microbicides and diagnostics.

- [Strategic action for overcoming drug resistance in malaria](#): The purpose of this Call for Proposals is to support one large-scale strategic action (clinical research activities) that is part of a bigger portfolio of clinical trials with the capacity to develop new and diverse antimalarial drugs against *Plasmodium falciparum* and/or *Plasmodium vivax*, including combination therapies that may be used for treatment or chemoprevention of malaria in sub-Saharan Africa.
